District and Community

Libertyville High School is located approximately 40 miles north of Chicago in Lake County. Community High School District 128 serves the communities of Green Oaks, Libertyville, Mettawa, Mundelein, Rondout and Vernon Hills, as well as surrounding unincorporated areas.

LHS, along with Vernon Hills High School, is one of two, four-year comprehensive high schools in Community High School District 128. District 128 received many honors during the 2009-10 school year, including the SchoolSearch Bright A+ Award of Excellence, the SchoolMatch Annual School System "What Parents Want Award," and being named to *Newsweek* Magazine's "America's Best High Schools" and the *U.S. News & World Report* annual ranking of the Best American High Schools.
